Wildfire... Are You Prepared?

Wildfires often begin unnoticed. They spread quickly, igniting brush, trees, and homes. Reduce your risk by preparing now – *before* wildfire strikes. Meet with your family to decide what to do and where to go if wildfires threaten your area. Some actions you can take to protect your home now include:

- Create and maintain 100 feet of defensible space
- Cut annual grass to a maximum height of four inches
- Ensure combustible materials are 30 feet from your home

Road Repairs and Tree Maintenance

The District is please to announce that it will be conducting its yearly road rehabilitation project. The District will be contracting to perform the necessary construction activities. This includes drainage ditching and patching of several sections of the ten miles of paved road managed by the District. A detailed breakdown of the project can be found on the District website.

In addition, the District has contracted with Tree J Arbor to improve access and visibility by trimming trees adjacent to roadways managed by the District. Much of this work has already been completed and it is the District's hope that the community is satisfied with the improved clearance.

Bicyclist Awareness

Christian Valley Park, CSD, would like to remind its residents to be cautious of bicyclists while on the road. A new California law requires vehicles move over an entire lane before overtaking a bicycle. While this is impractical throughout Christian Valley, we ask the community to do what they can to avoid unnecessary roadway incidences.

Report Unauthorized Hydrant Use

Residents are being asked to report any unauthorized fire hydrant use to the District. Improper use of hydrants by commercial vehicles can cause a backflow situation which can heavily contaminate our water with dangerous chemicals, such as pesticides, metals, and other toxins. When reporting unauthorized hydrant use, please provide their company name if possible. Let's keep our water clean!
